

Brochure Directions

Back flap (right side of back) should contain at least two of the most important scientists that did work on your topic and what they did. It must also contain your list of vocabulary words (not their definitions).

Back side (middle of back) should be a very brief outline of your talk so that the viewers can follow along, AND a few statements on how your topic is related to the talk before you and after you.

The front page must include:

- a. title
- b. picture/drawing pertaining to the topic
- c. brief statement that will grab our attention
- d. group member's names and period

Part of your group's presentation is to construct an informative handout for your topic. Your brochure must meet the following specifications:

The brochure must be an 8 1/2" x 11" sheet that is tri-folded with a landscape layout, just like this one is.

Middle section (entire inside) must have the important information about the topic. You may use more pictures, if they support your topic, to go along with your information. This section must contain the information needed to answer test questions and define your vocabulary words.

Remember, if you have a unique approach to this, you can do it, just get it cleared through the Head Scientist. You are limited only by your creativity and imagination. Let them run free in this area. There will be extra points given for creativity.
