<p>R.CCR.1 Read closely to determine what the text says explicitly and to make logical inferences from it; cite specific textual evidence when writing or speaking to support conclusions drawn from the text.</p>	<p><u>Questions to Focus Learning</u></p> <p>How do readers use informational text to support their critical understanding/analysis of a text?</p> <p>Informational text analysis needs to be supported by explicit information in the text, as well as inferences the reader draws from the text.</p> <p><u>Student Friendly Objectives</u></p> <p><i>Knowledge Targets</i></p> <p>I know an analysis is a detailed examination of text. I know inferences are drawn through background knowledge and details in a text. I know explicit information and ideas are directly stated in the text. I know implicit information and ideas are not directly stated in the text. I know citing textual evidence means to quote, summarize, or paraphrase from a text to support an argument or a claim.</p> <p><i>Reasoning Targets</i></p> <p>I can draw conclusions about what a text is saying, explicitly and implicitly. I can make inferences from text to make and support my analysis. I can determine which piece(s) of textual evidence will support my analysis.</p>
