I can apply the writing process to improve and strengthen my writing. Product Targets With some guidance and support from peers and adults: I can write a story by taking it through the writing process of prewriting (planning), writing, revising, editing, and rewriting. I can try a new approach in the process of writing my story. I can write a piece of writing that connects to the audience and aligns with the purpose.
