	I know that a print source is cited differently than a digital source, although some components are the same. Students must know a works cited page appears at the end of a paper, and lists the information actually used within the written research project. I know citations appear at the end of a text (e.g., bibliography, works cited) and within the body of the text (e.g., footnotes, parenthetical references). I know that MLA format is used to cite sources.
	Reasoning Targets
	I can develop writing that includes citations within the text (e.g. footnotes, parenthetical references). I can focus and narrow my search terms to related subtopics and aspects of the original topic. I can determine the credibility of a source. I can determine when and how to cite different print and digital resources.
