



## Creating Vocabulary Cue Cards (L.11-12.6)

### Procedure:

Write the word, its part of speech, and the definition in the upper right hand corner of a 3 x 5 or a 5 x 7 card.

Create a CUE for the word underneath the definition (A CUE is some concrete object or image that sounds like the vocabulary word.)

Draw or cut and paste a picture in the center of the card, illustrating the CUE.

Compose a phrase that uses the cue and the vocabulary word together.

Write three sentences using the vocabulary word correctly at the bottom of the page.

Neatly bind your cards together, using a binder ring or ribbon or a brad of some type.

**VOCABULARY CUE CARD EXAMPLE**

Tenacious

Adjective

Tough; stubborn, not giving up

CUE: Tennis Aces



1. The athlete was **tenacious** and refused to give up even though he was exhausted.
2. Joe is a **tenacious** athlete, and he will never give up on a match.
3. Andre Agassi is a **tenacious** athlete because he will play for hours and hours if he has to in order to win.
