Ouestions to Focus Learning How does understanding the structure of our language and words help us increase our vocabulary and comprehension? When readers encounter a difficult or unfamiliar word during reading there are multiple strategies they can use to help determine its meaning. Using these strategies to comprehend new words will aid in comprehension and vocabulary development.  Student Friendly Objectives Knowledge Targets  I know cause and effect relationships and comparisons in text are types of context clues. I know the meaning of an unfamiliar word may be signaled by a cause/effect relationship between ideas. I know key words may signal a comparison with an unfamiliar word (e.g., similar to, in the same way, as). I can identify key words in text that may provide clues as to the meaning of an unknown word.  Reasoning Targets  I can use cause and effect relationships in text to determine the meaning of an unknown word. I can use comparisons in text to determine the meaning of an unknown word. I can use common, grade-appropriate Greek and Latin affixes and roots to determine the meaning of unknown words in text.

## Teacher Tips

<u>Acquiring Vocabulary</u> - Appendix A: pages 32-35: Domain-specific words and phrases – Vocabulary specific to a particular field of study (domain), such as the human body (CCSS, p. 33); in the Standards, domain-specific words and phrases are analogous to Tier Three words (Language, p. 33). General academic words and phrases – Vocabulary common to written texts but not commonly a part of speech; in the Standards, general academic words and phrases are analogous to Tier Two words and phrases (Language, p. 33).
