	<p><u>Questions to Focus Learning</u></p> <p>How does phonemic awareness support students in their ability to read and write?</p> <p>The ability to orally blend sounds together leads to blending sounds when reading. The ability to orally isolate sounds in words leads to writing sounds in sequence to make words.</p> <p><u>Student Friendly Objectives</u></p> <p><i>Knowledge Targets</i></p> <p>I know words are made up of sounds. I know words can be segmented into sounds.</p> <p><i>Reasoning Targets</i></p> <p>I can identify the first sound in a word. I can identify the middle vowel sound in a word. I can identify the last sound in a word.</p> <p><i>Performance Targets</i></p> <p>I can say the first sound in a word. I can say the middle vowel sound in a word. I can say the last sound in a word.</p>

	<p><u>Vocabulary</u></p> <p>first identify last middle sound vowel</p> <p><u>Teacher Tips</u></p> <p>C-V-C Phonemes - Students will learn C-V-C words and act them out while spelling them.</p> <p>Elkonian Boxes - Students isolate the sounds they hear in C-V-C words using Elkonian Boxes.</p> <p>Letter-Sound Correspondence - Students will choose an item out of a bag and then determine the final sound of the object. Students will record final sounds on an attached recording sheet.</p> <p>Medial Vowel Trains - Students will sort pictures by the medial vowel sound they hear when pronouncing the names of the pictures.</p> <p>Sounding Out C-V-C Words - Students will build C-V-C words using magnetic letters.</p> <p><u>Vertical Progression</u></p> <p>RF.1.2 - Demonstrate understanding of spoken words, syllables, and sounds (phonemes).</p>
